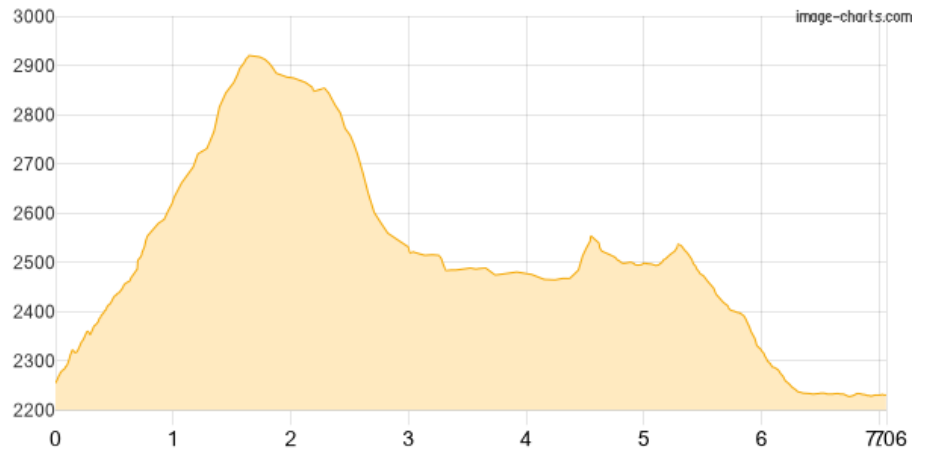

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Beschreibung

Route Start/Begin a steep 642m ascent from Augsburger Hütte to Gatschkopf (2945m) and then proceed walking down on the ridge until Patroscharte (2846m). No significant obstacle or exposure expected. At Patroscharte, possibility of climbing Parseierspitze via the southface can be considered under good condition. See PARSEIERSPITZE DETOUR. Continue by going down the Patroscharte towards Memminger Hütte. The steep descent is a secured trail first passing, with risk of rock falls, through Parseierjoch (2560m) and proceed to follow the Speihlerweg until the Wegscharte (2580m). At this point it is possible to consider going West along the ridge to Hinterseekopf (2718m) and Mittlerseekopf (2702m) then back on what is now the E4/E5 (this adds ~190m of ascent). At this point, it is only a 30min/158m descent to the Memminger Hütte. Route End/Day ends at Memminger Hütte. Bad Weather / Detours/PARSEIERSPITZE DETOUR/From Patroscharte, approach via the Grinner Ferner glacier (which is more of a snow field nowadays, though microspikes could be a good idea), and start the climb. While the first part of the climb is secured (~ A/B in VF grade), the second half (?) is unsecured and of grade II/T5, therefore absolute surefootness and no fear of heights is needed. The main danger seems to be from loose and falling rocks; a helmet is mandatory here. The crux of the route is a low-grip plate crossing, behind it a steep upswing along a plate fault zone (II), happening almost at the start of the route. Special attention should also be given to not accidentally take on the harder (III) Ostgrat. After reaching summit, climb back down same way and regroup at Patroscharte. IN CASE OF BAD WEATHER There isn't much easier alternative, as the way to Patroscharte and Parseierscharte is already the easiest route available. In case of extreme bad weather, Grins can be reached from Augsburger Hütte in ~2h05 (1200m descent), and the easier E5 can be reached from Zams. The Grins-Zams connection can be most likely done by taxi or bus (Zams Lötztal station). The a very long ascent via the E5 (13.5km/1845m). Another possibility is to forfeit Memminger Hütte altogether and sleep in the valley near Schann then pick up the ascent to Ansbacher Hütte via the 635,
